

## **Unity of the Trinity**

God exists in three Persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—each of whom is distinct from each of the others.

The Father is not the Son nor the Holy Spirit. The Son is not the Father nor the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is not the Father nor the Son.

Each of the Persons is God: the Father is God, the Son is God, and the Holy Spirit is God.

Three distinct Persons share in one divine God, just as three distinct fingers share in a common hand; just as a solid, liquid and gas share states of water.

The three divine persons are the same in virtue of their essence. The three divine persons are different in virtue of their roles and appearances.
